I John Warland Marine now belonging to His Majesty's Ship the Swift being of sound and disposing mind and memory do hereby make this my last Will and Testament first and principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping for Remission of all my Sins through the merits of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour and Redeemer and my Body to the Buriall or Sea as it shall please God and as for such worldly Estate and Effects which I shall be possessed of or intitled unto at the time of my decease I give and bequeath the same as followeth that is to say unto my loving kinsman John Woodward of the parish of S^t Andrew's Zoolborn and also Citizen and Weaver of London and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint the said John Woodward Executor of this my last Will and Testament and I do give and bequeath unto my said Executor all the Rest and Residue of my Estate whatsoever both real and personal hereby revoking and making void all other and former Wills by me heretofore made and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty seventh day of February in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and forty three and in the seventh year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the third by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith John Warland signed sealed published and declared by the said John Warland at and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who have herunto subscribed our names as Witnesses in this presence of the said Executor of this Will and Testament in Special Lawe John Bubb in Barnards Duns John Woodward Jones.

was proved at London before the Worshipful John Betherworth Doctor of Laws Surrogate to the Right Worshipful John De Wittesworth also Doctor of Laws Master or Keeper or Commissary of the prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted On the twenty seventh day of November in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and fifty by the Oath of John Woodward the Executor named in the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the deceased being first sworn duly to administer &c.
